
COLLABORATING FOR COMMUNITY Annual Report 2016–2017

It was the late 1980s, and a hospital dedicated to the elderly was an untested idea. But the need to plan for an ageing population was undeniable. It was time to act.

We reached out – to the government, to our supporters and to the community – engaging in sustained dialogue on resources and needs. That process bore fruit with the opening of St Luke's Hospital in 1996. St Luke's ElderCare came into being in 1999 to meet the need for services that bridge hospital and home such as day care and rehabilitation.

20 Years of Impact

Dialogue and collaborations have remained vital as we established new facilities and pioneered services for the elderly with the aim of providing seamless care from hospital to community and home.

Twenty years on, our ecosystem spans 16 ElderCare Centres, a community health centre as well as home care services.

More than bricks and stones, what we are today owes itself to people coming together to drive creative solutions to meet the needs of the elderly.

In 2016, St Luke's marked the 20th year since we first opened our doors, and admitted our first patient.

To commemorate this milestone, we held a dinner to recognise and thank all who have helped us get to this point, including founding members, past and present colleagues, partners and friends of St Luke's. It was a meaningful time of reflection, of taking account of challenges faced and overcome, and celebrating successes achieved.

Complementing this was the 'Loving Our Seniors Carnival', a joyful anniversary celebration with residents, clients, partner organisations and volunteers.

We came away from these two events humbled by the achievements of those who came before us, and inspired by the difference we could yet make.

Investing in Core Services

Even as we address the healthcare needs of the elderly, we recognise that ageing well also means being part of the community, and engaging with it.

In 2016, we opened three ElderCare Centres – Chong Pang, Nee Soon Central and Nee Soon East. These are more than just hubs for care services for the elderly. Their roster of programmes includes activities to encourage intergenerational bonding and those to help the elderly deepen their social networks within the community.

Investing in the Community

We continue to strengthen our ties to our network of healthcare partners, corporate supporters, grassroots organisations, schools and volunteers to promote healthy ageing and social inclusion.

The Wellness Kampung, a partnership with Alexandra Health Systems and grassroots organisations, is a good example of this. Under this initiative, wellness kampungs are established where residents can develop social networks to inspire each other to adopt healthier lifestyles.

Another example is our partnership with Cycling Without Age, which provided volunteers to give our seniors trishaw rides in what was a memorable outing.

Investing in Our People

Caring and serving the elderly requires not merely competence, but also a caring attitude and a desire to serve. We have a wonderful team in place, one that has won numerous accolades for quality care and service excellence. The year 2016 was no exception, with seven of our staff recognised at the ILTC (Intermediate and Long Term Care) Excellence Awards.

Staff development is key to long-term growth and we place great importance on supporting programmes to enhance skills and develop careers.

Investing in Technology

As part of our efforts to improve operational efficiency, we are implementing a new IT-based client-patient management system complete with tablet-style mobile devices that would make it easier and more convenient for our staff to input and pull up patient records. We have also improved broadband connectivity at all centres.

Looking Ahead

Moving forward, we will continue to focus on strengthening our partnerships to create communities of care for our elderly and provide integrated care services in the community. We expect to add another two centres, in line with our commitment to expand our services, develop innovative care and broaden our reach.

Finally, I would like to thank our volunteers, church partners, schools, caregivers, corporate partners, grassroots partners and those whom we have worked with this past year.



Five-Year Review of Clients Served at Our Centres




Number of Client Days over the Last 5 years




Number of Rehab Sessions over the Last 5 Years

INNOVATIVE SPACES

Ageing with dignity and grace requires that we go beyond physical or clinical healthcare. Social and emotional connections with family, friends and the community at large are just as fundamental to the wellbeing of seniors.



Fresh Approaches

Recognising the need for fresh, innovative approaches to healthy ageing, we continue to expand our reach and enhance our spaces. In 2016, we opened three centres – Chong Pang, Nee Soon Central and Nee Soon East.

Community Focus

Our ElderCare Centres provide seniors and their caregivers with safe, supportive spaces within the community for rehabilitative services and daycare. Increasingly also, these centres serve as a significant hub for engagement between seniors and their community. These centres actively develop intergenerational programmes and ties with volunteers, supporters and businesses.

Nee Soon Central Wins Singapore Good Design Mark 2017

St Luke's ElderCare at Nee Soon Central showcases our focus on creating welcoming spaces that allow seniors to age with dignity and grace within the community. While conveniently located within a HDB void deck, it exudes the inviting ambience of a clubhouse.

The design cleverly incorporates pillars which introduce natural privacy barriers within an open space. The bright, airy spaces allow for meaningful activities such as intergenerational programmes to take place within the community.

In recognition of its inspirational design that meets care objectives while providing an environment that fosters social and community bonds, the centre was awarded the Singapore Good Design Mark 2017.

ENHANCED TECHNOLOGY

Award-Winning System

An exciting development is the implementation of the Community-Based Care (CBC) IT System. This real-time, web-based solution for client/patient management and administration is also seamlessly integrated with the Agency for Integrated Care's Community Care Systems. Slated to be fully operational by June 2017, it substantially enhances our ability to provide timely, targeted services.

The ambitious scope of this initiative was recognised at the 2017 National Health IT Excellence Awards, where our team won in the 'IT Excellence: Digitised Care to Support One Healthcare System' category.

High-Speed Connectivity

Staff at our 16 centres including our rehabilitation and home care teams will be able to access the web-based system using mobile tablet devices as well as desktops and laptops. To support the system, we have enhanced our internet connectivity, with high-speed Wi-Fi at our centres and provision for mobile internet services where required.

Our IT upgrades to increase operational efficiency also extend to our Kallang Pudding headquarters, where we have installed high-speed fibre broadband and Wi-Fi as well as advanced printers and interactive projectors.

One-Stop Efficiency

With the implementation of the CBC IT system, our staff will no longer have to go into multiple systems to perform functions such as processing referrals, inputting data and retrieving client records, resulting in significant manpower and time savings.

Since the database is updated almost instantaneously, reporting and data analytics could be performed more frequently (rather than monthly under the previous manual system). This allows for faster response in areas such as manpower planning.

WINNING TEAM

At St Luke's ElderCare, we have put together a team of staff who have distinguished themselves by their creativity, enthusiasm and most of all a heart for those they serve. We are extremely proud to see them receiving well-deserved awards and recognition.

The Courage Fund Healthcare Humanity Awards 2016



The Courage Fund Healthcare Humanity Awards is a legacy of the Courage Awards that were first given out in 2003 following the outbreak of Severe Acute Respiratory Syndrome (SARS) in Singapore. In recognition of their contributions and for going beyond their call of duty, five members of staff from St Luke's were recognised at the 2016 awards.

ILTC Excellence Awards 2016

The ILTC Excellence Awards was initiated by the Agency for Integrated Care in 2014. It recognises the contributions of community care staff who have displayed exemplary service and commitment in delivering quality care to their clients. Seven of our staff received Silver Awards in the Service Quality category.



Singapore Health Quality Service Awards 2017

The Singapore Health Quality Service Awards celebrates and honours healthcare professionals who have delivered quality care and excellent service standards. Our staff won 21 Silver Individual Awards and 1 Gold Individual Award.

They were also awarded the Best Team Intermediate and Long-term Care (ILTC) Service Initiative Improvement Award (Friends On Board). The service initiative resulted in more therapy slots, extended contact time, greater efficiency in terms of transport trips provided, and more positivity during group sessions as everyone was supportive of one another.



IMPACTFUL COLLABORATIONS

St Luke's ElderCare continues to work with our partners, strengthening cooperation and bonds in the community, to form new initiatives, services, and academic and infrastructure collaborations.



Wellness Kampung

St Luke's ElderCare, Alexandra Health Systems and Nee Soon grassroots organisations launched the Wellness Kampung at Block 765 Nee Soon Central in September 2016. The initiative encourages graceful ageing through wellness and active ageing activities, initiatives and programmes.



Transforming Community Care with JurongHealth

St Luke's ElderCare and St Luke's Hospital signed a memorandum of understanding (MoU) with Jurong Health Services (JurongHealth) in October 2016. The aim of the MoU is to enhance the community care landscape in the western region of Singapore.

AIC Wellness Programme

The AIC Wellness Programme – developed by the National Arts Council and taught at the Agency for Integrated Care (AIC) Learning Institute – equipped our staff with the skills to lead art workshops for clients at our centres. Our clients created many beautiful pieces in the workshops, from batik paintings to mosaic art. Their work was exhibited at the AICareLink @ Maxwell.



River Safari Visit with AIMS AMP Capital

AIMS AMP Capital Industrial REIT Management Limited partnered with us to organise a visit to River Safari. They gave our volunteers, staff and clients a delightful lunch and cruise rides. Everyone truly enjoyed themselves as they strolled through the covered walkways while admiring some of the 6,000 species of animals found there.

'Support Our Pioneers' Programme

SLEC partnered with Heartware Network to develop this initiative in March 2017. This home befriending programme aims to encourage youths to provide social support to our clients by visiting them at their home on weekends. The service was piloted at the Golden Years Centre.

Our ongoing partnership with Dignity Kitchen was boosted by the addition of a learning opportunity for our clients. The Cook and Bake session held at their premises was a resounding success.

Indian Heritage Centre Tour

Volunteers and clients from our Hougang and Serangoon centres had an enjoyable visit to the Indian Heritage Centre in September 2016. This tour was organised in collaboration with the National Council of Social Service (NCSS) and the Indian Heritage Centre.

This activity gave volunteers from NCSS the opportunity to befriend our clients, encouraging intergenerational interaction through conversations and creative activities. Our clients were delighted, together with the volunteers, to design their own tote bags using colour pencils, crayons and markers.
