## A CAREGIVER'S JOURNEY

## In The Beginning

When Constance's late father, Mr Chua Chok, was still around, his wife, Mdm Siek, was his full-time caregiver. Mr Chua was battling cancer and underwent chemotherapy for treatment. Besides caregiving, Mdm Siek also singlehandedly managed the household chores, groceries and cooked their meals.

When Mr Chua went on to be with the Lord in September 2018, Mdm Siek grieved deeply over the loss of her partner and best friend of 48 years.

She slipped into depression and lost a lot of weight. The depression affected Mdm Siek's cognitive function and she could not conduct her daily activities of living, such as bathing. Her daughter, Constance, had to move in to take care of her.

Constance was suddenly faced with the task of taking care of her mother and did not know what to do. She sought advice from her friends who recommended her to the nearby St Luke's ElderCare (SLEC) Telok Blangah Centre. The Centre Manager readily assisted and got Mdm Siek registered with the centre to begin her recovery journey.

### **Her Caregiving Routine**

Every morning at 6.30am, Constance will gently tap on her mum and say, "Ma, it's time to wake up to go to 'school'", evoking excitement in Mdm Siek. 'School' is the word Constance uses to refer to St Luke's ElderCare (SLEC) Telok Blangah Centre, which Mdm Siek attends for day care.

Constance will then assist her mother with her bath, getting dressed, and prepare breakfast, before sending Mdm Siek to the centre. They would be listening to hymns in the background and Mdm Siek would hum to worship songs such as "活出爱Live Out Love"



The team at the centre has provided Constance with the assurance that her mother enjoys her time there and is cared for with love.

#### **Her Spiritual Journey**

Aside from the dedicated team at the centre, church volunteers from Telok Ayer Chinese Methodist Church would come by the centre weekly to share the Word of God, sing worship songs and even bring the elders on outings from time to time.

The weekly visits have helped Mdm Siek to open up, enabling her to connect with the church volunteers through songs. "Their unwavering encouragements together with that from the centre's care staff enabled my mother to be more open to try new things," said Constance. "By the grace of God, my mother can now take on her daily activities of living with minimal assistance," she added.

## **Meaningful Engagements**

Mdm Siek was initially reluctant to go on outings as she would complain of pain to the leg. However, with the constant encouragement from the staff, she eventually gave it a try. With each outing, Mdm Siek began to enjoy herself more thoroughly.

One such outing was to the newly opened Jewel Changi Airport where caregivers and family members were invited to spend time with their loved ones as volunteers. Constance was delighted to soak in the atmosphere and explore the nature-themed entertainment and retail complex with her mum for the first time.

Floral arrangement sessions at the centre also sparked an interest in Mdm Siek. Organised by Noel Gifts, Mdm Siek and the elders were given fresh flowers to create their very own bouquet. "I am glad my mom enjoys her time at the centre. I recalled the instance where my mother came back very happy with her bouquet," said Constance.

SLEC serves more than 4,000 elders and their family. Many family members like Constance often juggle the roles of being a mother, a full-time employee and a caregiver at the same time. - Learn to communicate with empathy
- Learn to plan elder-friendly activities
